Competition Rules

1. The SDAA reserve the right to make alterations and additions to the programme.
2. Competitors compete at their own risk.
3. No refund will be given unless a "no dance" is declared or a doctor's certificate is produced.
4. Any complaint made by an individual against the association or adjudication of this event must be made to the Competition Convenor in writing within 48 hours and be accompanied by a \$5 fee which is refundable if the protest is upheld.
5. Any competitor who has been taught or advised by the judges during the three months prior to the competition shall not be eligible to compete.
6. Dancers must be in costumes for any official presentation of prizes.
7. Provided permission has been obtained from the organisers and the judge, video equipment and photography is allowed to film your own child or pupil. There is to be no flash photography while dancers are competing.
8. During the course of the competition the comportment of the competitor may come under the jurisdiction of the judges not only while dancing but also when entering and leaving the platform and whilst waiting for the dance to start. Any unseemly behaviour on the part of the competitor or any misdemeanour likely to upset the decorum of the proceedings may be penalised by the judges and could lead to disqualification, but a full report of any such misconduct on the part of a competitor must be submitted by the judges to the organiser.
9. Additional prizes will be awarded in Premier for dancers who are "Restricted" - that is, have not been placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in a championship since 2015.
